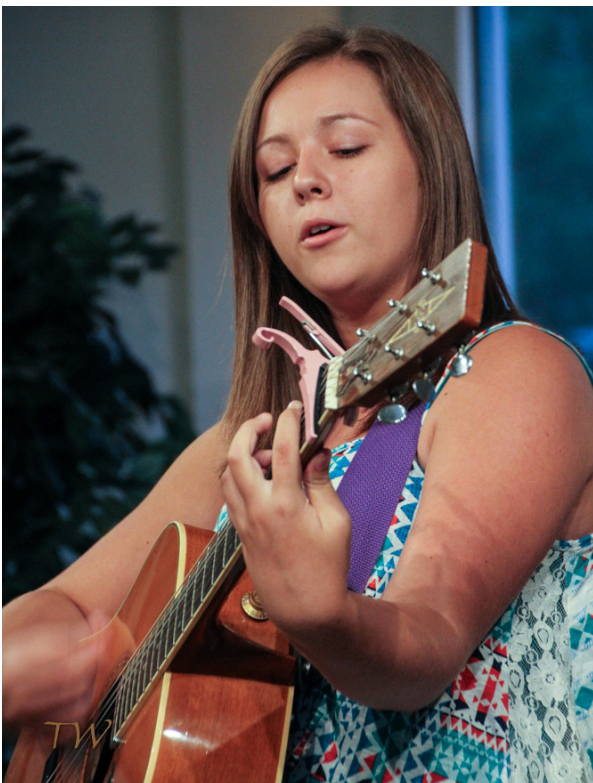
MARYE AMANDA MCDANIEL
