Washington, NC: The Fall 2012 Tar Landing Jam is presented by the Beaufort County Traditional Music Association and Tar Landing Company LLC. It will be held on November 3, at 304 Tar Landing Drive, Bath, NC. In tribute to the memory of folk icon Doc Watson, the Fall 2012 Tar Landing Jam will feature two of North Carolina's best guitar pickers: Tommy Edwards and Jack Lawrence. It will benefit the Bath High School Preservation project and tickets are \$10.00.

The event will begin at 2:30 pm with a community jam. Musicians of all skill levels are invited to come out and participate in the jam. Beginning at 5:00 pm, entertainment will be provided by: The Skinner Family Trio, Tiki Roadhouse, The Flatland Zingers, and Ann Meadows. Tommy Edwards and Jack Lawrence will perform at 8:00 pm.



Tommy Edwards from Siler City is the leader of the legendary band, The Bluegrass Experience. He is an award winning multi-instrumentalist, who has performed throughout the U.S. for the past 40 years. In addition to The Bluegrass Experience, Tommy also performs with other bands including Carolina Lightnin' and Hot Tub of Grits.

Jack Lawrence, from Harrisburg, NC, traveled, performed and recorded with Doc Watson for over 20 years beginning in the mid 1980's. A "flatpicking powerhouse", his recordings and performances combine exciting, high spirited and innovative guitar solos with tasteful phrasing in his own inventive style. Jack's inspired playing and smooth vocals provide listeners with performances that span musical traditions.



Tommy and Jack's combined performance is like having two old friends (that just happen to be two of the most accomplished guitar pickers you'll ever hear) sitting around swapping tunes. They bring what promises to be a spectacular and memorable show to the Fall 2012 Tar Landing Jam.

The Tar Landing Jam is located at 304 Tar Landing Dr., Bath, NC, just off Creek Rd. It is held in a large barn, so the event will take place "rain or shine" - dress appropriately for the day's temperature. It is a family friendly event and food will be available on-site. Seating is available, however folks are welcome to bring their own festival chairs.
